KY Pride 2026

The 2026 Kentucky General Assembly was rife with anti-LGBTQ legislative landmines. Despite the introduction of nearly a dozen anti-LGBTQ measures, including the return of a broad healthcare discrimination law, another bill to criminalize drag performers, threats to local Fairness Ordinances, attacks on Transgender teachers, and attempts to further restrict access to healthcare and restrooms, **we defeated every one, and state lawmakers gaveled out without sending any anti-LGBTQ laws to Governor Andy Beshear's desk.**

Our success this legislative session is thanks to intentional and difficult relationship building on both sides of the aisle, and bolstered by our expanded lobbying team, including the Commonwealth Alliances with Julia Bright, Kate Wood Hall, and Ben Haydon; Mica Nicole at Mica Nicole Consulting; and former Republican Secretary of State Trey Grayson with FBT Gibbons representing Kentucky Competes.

Now we'll buckle up for a bumpy Kentucky Election season, when too many candidates will seize upon perceived anti-LGBTQ sentiment for political gain. **We need your help to elect pro-Fairness candidates all across the commonwealth.** Look inside for Primary Election endorsements and stay tuned for upcoming election news at FairnessVotes.com.

2025 Fairness Campaign Year In Review

Jan. 7: The 2025 Kentucky General Assembly convenes.

Jan. 18: A Statewide LGBTQ Leadership Summit is hosted by JustFundKY, Fairness Campaign, and Louisville Youth Group at the Louisville Pride Center with dozens of Kentucky LGBTQ organizations and nearly 100 queer leaders to reflect on the election and strategize for the future.

Jan. 21-26: Fairness Campaign staff and interns attend the National LGBTQ Task Force's Creating Change Conference in Las Vegas, NV.

Jan. 21: The Q-Group of the St. Matthews Chamber of Commerce invites the Fairness Campaign for a presentation on LGBTQ legislation in Kentucky.

Jan. 23: The Fairness Campaign conducts LGBTQ 101 training for new Louisville Metro Department of Corrections officers. The national PNC Proud LGBTQ business resource group meets in Louisville and invites the Fairness Campaign to speak on LGBTQ rights in Kentucky.

Jan. 26: Fairness Campaign Executive Director Chris Hartman celebrates 16 years on staff. **Louisville's original Fairness Ordinance turns 26 years old.**

Jan. 29: Middletown Christian Church hosts a panel discussion, "Where Do We Go from Here? A Conversation About the Future of LGBTQ+ Rights & How to Prepare," with Kentucky Health Justice Network and the Fairness Campaign.

Feb. 4: Louisville Collegiate School Pride Week features a panel discussion with UofL's LGBTQ Center, Louisville Youth Group, and the Fairness Campaign.

Feb. 9: Mandala House presents an LGBTQIA+ Legal Rights Day that includes informational sessions, volunteer attorneys, mental health resources, and networking with community organizations including the Fairness Campaign.

Feb. 13: **The Kentucky Senate Judiciary Committee approves Senate Bill 2, which bans gender affirming healthcare for Transgender Kentuckians incarcerated in state prisons and jails.**

Feb. 18: The Kentucky Senate votes 31-6 to send SB2 to the Kentucky House.

Feb. 20: The Kentucky Senate Judiciary Committee advance Senate Bill 60, which would expand the commonwealth's Religious Freedom Restoration Act and encourage the Alliance Defending Freedom to sue Kentucky cities and counties with Fairness Ordinances.

Feb. 21: The Bishop's Table at Gospel Missionary Church in Louisville includes an update on LGBTQ legislation from the Fairness Campaign.

Feb. 23: Bluegrass Classic Bowling's annual Bourbon Bowl in Louisville chooses the House of Ruth and Fairness Campaign as charitable beneficiaries of their tournament.

Feb. 26: The Kentucky Senate approves SB60 on a 29-7 vote after rejecting an amendment from Senator Keturah Herron that would protect civil rights laws. Despite the Senate vote, the House does not advance SB60 and the bill dies.

Feb. 27: **The Kentucky House State Government Committee approves House Bill 495, a measure which would explicitly legalize anti-LGBTQ conversion practices, as a response to Governor Andy Beshear's historic Executive Order banning such practices against Kentucky youth in 2024.**

March 4: The Kentucky Senate Health Services Committee advances Senate Bill 132, a broad "Healthcare Discrimination Law" that would allow any healthcare worker to refuse service based on religious, moral, or ethical beliefs.

March 5: Cincinnati HRC's Workplace Equality Committee presents an educational event, "Building and Maintaining Inclusive Workplaces in 2025," that features Equality Ohio and the Fairness Campaign. **The Kentucky House votes to amend HB495, removing the language that explicitly legalizes conversion practices and replacing it with a simple repeal of Governor Beshear's executive order. The amended version of HB495 passes the Kentucky House 77-18.**

March 7: The Kentucky Senate approves SB132 with a vote of 26-6.

March 11: **Kentucky Governor Andy Beshear and Lieutenant Governor Jacqueline Coleman kick off the annual Statewide Fairness Rally in the Capitol Rotunda.** With music by longtime Fairness Campaign leader Carol Kraemer-Straub, and emcee Rev. Donzella Lee, Executive Director of the Franklin-Simpson Human Rights Commission, the rally highlights Kentucky LGBTQ advocates Lexington-Fayette Urban County Councilmember Emma Curtis, Kentucky's first Black Trans candidate for elected office Carma Bell Marshall, former State House candidate and survivor of conversion practices Brandon Long, along with members of the legislature, Senate Minority Leader Gerald Neal, Senate Minority Caucus Chair Reggie Thomas, Senator Karen Berg, Senator Keturah Herron, Rep. Lisa Willner, and Rep. Adrielle Camuel.

March 12: **In a last-minute ambush, the Kentucky Senate Health Services Committee allows a committee substitute on HB495 to include a ban on state Medicaid support for hormone replacement therapy, essentially compromising healthcare for thousands of Transgender Kentuckians without debate.**

March 12: **The Kentucky House Judiciary Committee advances SB2.** The Kentucky House Health Services Committee approves SB132 for the first time ever. Despite advancing further than ever, SB132 stalls before final passage in the House.

March 13: Kentucky Young Democrats include the Fairness Campaign on their "Lobbyist Panel" during "Young Dems Day" at the Capitol. **The Kentucky Senate approves the amended HB495 28-6 after defeating an amendment from Senator Karen Berg that would delete the Medicaid ban on gender-affirming care.**

March 14: **The Kentucky House votes 73-12 on SB2 and it becomes law without the governor's signature, legally ending hormone replacement therapy in state jails and prisons.** HB495 is the second-to-last bill approved by the Kentucky House 67-19 ahead of Governor Beshear's veto period.

March 19: Former State Representative Jim Wayne and Fairness ED Chris Hartman meet with Louisville Archbishop Shelton Fabre and the Catholic Conference of Kentucky on LGBTQ issues in the state and to propose a Catholics for Fairness Synod series.

March 22: Susan Hershberg and Wiltshire Pantry host the 25th Fairness Dinner to raise a record \$250,000 for the Fairness Campaign at the Muhammad Ali Center. **Governor Andy Beshear shocks the sold-out crowd with a surprise veto of HB495 and a gift of the historic veto pen to Fairness.** Dinner Co-Chairs Ed Kruger and Elizabeth Sawyer are honored for leading the planning committee.

March 24: Kentucky Education Television's "Kentucky Tonight" features a debate on LGBTQ issues in the legislature with Lexington Councilmember Emma Curtis and Fairness ED Chris Hartman.

March 27: **The Kentucky Senate and House override Governor Beshear's veto on HB495, ending the governor's executive order on conversion practices and banning state Medicaid reimbursements for hormone replacement therapy.**

April 4: The Kentucky Education Association Diversity Committee honors the Fairness Campaign with the 2025 Smith-Wilson Award for Civil and Human Rights in Education, an honor previously bestowed upon Lyman T. Johnson and Ann Braden.

April 12: Emerge Kentucky hosts their annual "Endorsement Panel" that includes C-FAIR, the Political Action Committee of the Fairness Campaign. Pride of Morehead is held Downtown on First Street.

April 15: **Fairness hosts a dinner to honor outgoing Coordinating Committee leaders, Fairness Education Fund Chair Lizz Perkins and Vice Chair Morgan Whiting, and Fairness Campaign Chair Miles Justice.**

May 6: The Jefferson County Public Schools Superintendent Search Committee includes the Fairness Campaign at community forums and search deliberations.

May 14: The "Here to Pee" Trans Comedy Tour of all 50 states performs at Planet of the Tapes in Louisville and benefits the Fairness Campaign.

May 17: The Ashland Pride Picnic is held at Ashland Riverfront Park. Former Fairness leader **Dr. Kaila Story brings the tour of her first book, *The Rainbow Ain't Never Been Enuf: On the Myth of LGBTQ+ Solidarity*, to PLAY Dance Bar for a book dialogue with Fairness ED Chris Hartman.**

May 23: The Bluegrass Forward "Get Stuff Done Campaign" hosts a statewide convening at the Foundation for a Healthy Kentucky with dozens of statewide groups including the Fairness Campaign.

May 29: The Fairness Campaign conducts LGBTQ 101 training for new Louisville Metro Department of Corrections officers.

May 31: QueerKY Pride is held at Mile Wide Beer Co. in Louisville.

June 1: **Fairness Campaign Community Outreach Coordinator Alexander Griggs celebrates two years on staff.** The NKY Pride Center's NKY Pride Parade and Festival is held in Covington's Goebel Park.

June 5: The All Wool and a Yard Wide Democratic Club in Louisville hosts a "State of Fairness" speech for Pride Month.

June 7: Mount Sterling Pride is held in Dubois Community Center and Richmond Pride is held on E. Water St. LouCity FC hosts their annual Pride Night and honors Fairness ED Chris Hartman at half time.

June 8: Glasgow Pride is held in Beaver Creek Park.

June 14: Paducah Pride Festival is held at the Paducah-McCracken County Convention and Expo Center and Harlan Pride is held in Downtown Harlan.

June 16: **Fairness Campaign Development Associate Jenna Murnan celebrates two years on staff.**

June 21: The Kentuckiana Pride Parade and Festival is held at the Big Four Bridge in Louisville. Dozens of volunteers help the Fairness Campaign inflate 10,000 balloons for their "Human Balloon Float" in the Kentuckiana Pride Parade that celebrates 10 years of marriage equality and features Kentucky plaintiffs and attorneys from the Supreme Court case *Obergefell v. Hodges*.

June 22: The Owensboro Blue Ridge Pride Picnic is held at Unity Fellowship.
June 24: Frazier History Museum in Louisville hosts "10 Years of Marriage Equality," a panel discussion with Kentucky plaintiffs and attorneys, the Fairness Campaign, and local clergy.

June 25: The national Humana Pride Employee Resource Group celebrates Pride Month with a nationwide employee meeting, "Exploring LGBTQ+ Joy with the Fairness Campaign's Chris Hartman."

June 28: Corbin Pride is held at Nibroc Park, Lexington Pride Festival is held on Oliver Lewis Way, Henderson Pride is held in Central Park, and La Casita Center's Latinx Pride is held in Louisville.

July 12: Kentucky's Governor's Scholars Program invites the Fairness Campaign for the first time to present during "Explore Kentucky Day" at Murray State University.

July 15-18: Fairness Campaign staff and leaders join the national Equality Federation's Leadership Conference in Madison, WI. Fairness ED Chris Hartman delivers a Fed Talk, "Streeeeeeetching the Work."

July 27: The Speed Art Museum hosts "Back to School with Pride," a resource fair that includes the Fairness Campaign.

July 30: Congressman Morgan McGarvey gathers local LGBTQ leaders for a meeting and listening session.

July 31: QueerKY hosts a book talk with Nico Lang, author of *American Teenager: How Trans Kids Are Surviving Hate and Finding Joy in a Turbulent Era*, with the Fairness Campaign at Louisville Pride Center.

Aug. 8: The Fairness Campaign conducts LGBTQ 101 training for new Louisville Metro Department of Corrections officers.

Aug. 14-24: **Dozens of volunteers help staff the Fairness booth at the Kentucky State Fair for the 31st year in a row.**

Aug. 22: Common Ground Kentucky hosts its annual statewide membership convening with the Fairness Campaign and dozens of statewide grassroots progressive groups at Highland Community Ministries in Louisville.

Aug. 25: University of Louisville convenes a dialogue with top leaders at the Fairness Campaign's request to discuss the future of LGBTQ scholarships and programming in the wake of Kentucky's DEI ban in higher education.

Aug. 29-30: Murray Pride is held across Downtown Murray.

Sept. 6: Louisville Pride is held on Bardstown Road, where Fairness ED Chris Hartman is honored with Louisville Pride Foundation's Lifetime Achievement Award.

Sept. 11-14: Kentucky Black Pride Festival is held across Lexington, with Pride in the Park held on Sept. 13 in Woodland Park.

Sept. 18: **More than 300 supporters help raise over \$36,000 for Fairness during the Community Foundation of Louisville's annual "Give for Good."**

Sept. 19-21: Melanin Pride Weekend is held across Louisville.

Sept. 24: The Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services hosts a Hispanic Resource Fair that includes the Fairness Campaign.

Sept. 27: Berea Pride is held at Berea Friends Meeting House, Pikeville Pride is held at Appalachian Wireless Arena Park, and Augusta Pride is held at Augusta River Park.

Sept. 28: **Boone County Pride is held at the Florence Y'alls Stadium. Fairness serves as fiscal sponsor for Boone County Pride, which jumps from dozens of attendees its first year to nearly 1,000 at the stadium.** Indivisible Louisville hosts "We the People Palooza" with the Fairness Campaign and other progressive Kentucky organizations.

Sept. 29: St. Andrew United Church of Christ invites the Fairness Campaign for a legislative update and information session during their Mission and Outreach meeting.

Oct. 1: **The Fairness Campaign launches a second round of its Passport Navigation program, aimed at helping Transgender Kentuckians obtain expedited U.S. passports with correct gender markers for free while federal courts allow.**

Oct. 4: A second Statewide LGBTQ Leadership Summit is hosted by JustFundKY, Common Ground Kentucky, Louisville Youth Group, and Fairness Campaign at Highland Community Ministries in Louisville.

Oct. 11: Capital Pride Festival is held in Downtown Frankfort.

Oct. 14: ECU Pride in the Plaza includes Fairness and other LGBTQ supportive organizations in Richmond. Taylor's B.L.U.E.S. presents "Breaking the Silence on Disenfranchised Grief," a day-long gathering at Louisville's Waterfront Botanical Gardens with a panel discussion joined by the Fairness Campaign. A George Floyd Remembrance Rally is held in Louisville's Injustice Square with the Fairness Campaign among its speakers.

Oct. 16: The Richmond Human Rights Commission hosts a public meeting with the Fairness Campaign on the renewed effort to pass a Richmond Fairness Ordinance.

Oct. 18: Danville Pride Festival is held at Pioneer Playhouse and Winchester Pride is held in Downtown Winchester.

Oct. 23: Simmons College of Kentucky conducts a staff training on LGBTQ issues presented by the Fairness Campaign.

Oct. 25: **Bowling Green Pride, which is produced by the Fairness Campaign and Bowling Green Fairness, is held in Circus Square Park. Former State Rep. Patti Minter and Lucinda Anderson are honored for their leadership and dedication to Fairness in Bowling Green.** The Pride of London is held in Levi Jackson Wilderness Road Park and Somerset Chill Out and Proud is held at Somerset Community College's Festival Field.

Oct. 29: The Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services hosts an LGBTQ Resource Fair that includes the Fairness Campaign.

Oct. 31: Fairness Campaign Co-Founder Lisa Gunterman joins Fairness staff for a presentation to a University of Louisville Kent School of Social Work Social Justice Policy Class.

Nov. 1: **The ACLU of Kentucky celebrates its 70th anniversary at the Speed Art Museum.**

Nov. 12: The Kentucky House Democratic Caucus gathers at Boone Tavern in Berea for its annual retreat that includes a legislative preview from the Fairness Campaign.

Nov. 14: The Fairness Campaign conducts LGBTQ 101 training for new Louisville Metro Department of Corrections officers.

Nov. 18: **The Human Rights Campaign releases its Municipal Equality Index. Covington, Lexington, and Louisville once again achieve perfect 100 scores.** Other Kentucky cities score: Berea – 29, Bowling Green – 31, Frankfort – 65, Morehead – 60, and Owensboro – 30.

Nov. 20: Transgender Day of Remembrance events are held at Robert F. Stephens Courthouse Plaza in Lexington and Highland Community Ministries in Louisville.

Dec. 2: QueerKY presents "Queer Politics in the Bluegrass: What's at Stake in 2026," a panel discussion with the Fairness Campaign and local leaders in Covington.

Dec. 7: Dozens of past and present Fairness Campaign leaders gather for the annual Fairness Leadership Brunch at Vernon Lanes in Louisville.

Dec. 9: QueerKY presents "Queer Politics in the Bluegrass: What's at Stake in 2026," a panel discussion with the ACLU of Kentucky, Fairness Campaign, State Senator Karen Berg, and State Rep. Lisa Willner in Louisville.

Dec. 14: Pandora Productions brings its production of Holiday Play to the Fairness Campaign office.

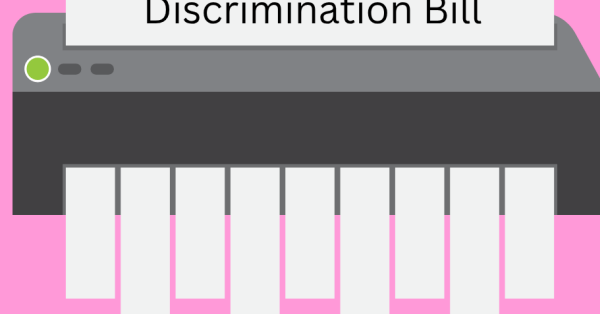
